



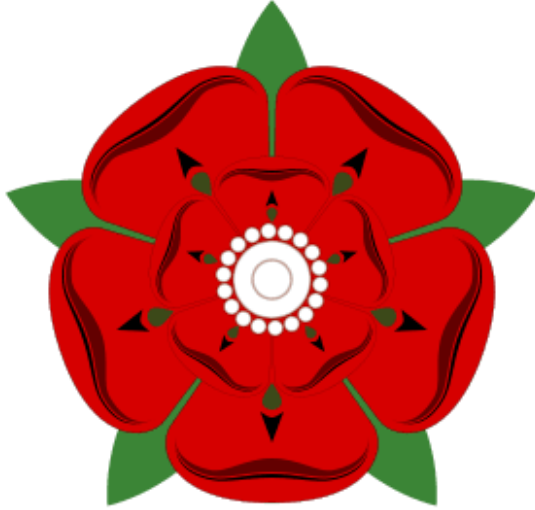

The heavy defeat of the English in the Hundred Years' War between England and France shakes the confidence of King Henry VI, a child of the House of Lancaster, who has just ascended the throne. As Henry begins to show signs of mental illness, the question of central authority arises, and the disputes between the York and Lancaster families over who should rule divide England in two.

In a conflict where the thorns of roses make each other bleed, it's up to you to shape Britain's future!

Important Events During the War

1st of June 1453

- The Percy-Neville Trial

In 1453, Henry VI had begun efforts to stop the violence caused by various disputes between noble families. These disputes gradually polarized around the long-standing Percy-Neville feud and became identified with the Percy cause.

This pushed the Nevilles into the arms of York, which now for the first time had support among a section of the nobility.

The Percy-Neville feud was a series of conflicts, raids and vandalism between two prominent northern English families, the House of Percy and the House of Neville and their followers, which helped provoke the Wars of the Roses

The original cause of the long dispute is unknown, and the first incidents of violence were in the 1450s, before the Wars of the Roses.

22nd of May 1455

- York Rebellion and the First Battle of St. Albans:
- A Yorkist victory following the York Rebellion in which the Duke of Somerset was killed. The Duke of York was reappointed Regent and was deposed in 1456. Queen Margaret fanned the flames of anti-York sentiment at

court . Richard Duke of York's influence weakened and he was excluded from the royal council.

- 23rd of September 1459

Battle of Blore Heath.

Yorkist Victory.

- 12nd of October 1459

Battle of Ludford Bridge.

A victory for the House of Lancaster. Richard of York has escaped to Ireland.

- 10th of July 1460

Battle of Northampton.

Yorkist Victory. Henry VI has been captured. The Earl of Warwick orders the slaughter of all prisoners. The Queen flees to Wales.

- 10th of October 1460

Richard of York, who had been appointed heir, returns to England. In response, a new army is formed by the Queen.

- 30th of December 1460

Battle of Wakefield.

A victory for the House of Lancaster, Richard of York is killed and is succeeded by his son Edward.

- 2nd of February 1461

War of Mortimer's Cross.

Yorkist Victory, After the death of Richard of York, Edward, the son of the brace, achieved the victory.

- 17th of February 1461

Second Battle of St Albans.

A victory for the House of Lancaster. Henry VI. rescued.

- 4th of March 1461

Edward of York, Edward IV., proclaimed king in London.

- 9th of March 1461

Battle of Towton. Another Yorkist victory for The Earl of Warwick. King Henry, Queen Margaret and the Prince of Wales have flown to Scotland.

- 24th of June 1465

Henry VI. captured and imprisoned in the Tower of London.

- 1st of May 1470

After quarrelling with Edward IV., Warwick the Kingmaker fled to France. There, he joined forces with Queen Margaret before returning to England and restoring the Lancastrian Henry VI. to the throne on 13th October

- 14th of March 1471

The Yorkist King Edward fled to France, returning with a small army

- 14th of April 1471

Battle of Barnet. A victory for Edward's Yorkist army.

Warwick the Kingmaker has been killed.

- 4th of May 1471

Battle of Tewkesbury. A defeat for the Lancastrian army, led by Queen Margaret and the Prince of Wales. The Prince of Wales was killed and the queen was captured.

- 21st-22nd of May 1471

Henry VI was killed in the Tower of London. Henry Tudor, the Earl of Richmond and Lancastrian claimant to the throne, fled to France.

The Yorkist Edward IV was now the undisputed king.

- 9th of April 1483

Death of Edward IV, succeeded by his young son Edward V.

- June of 1483

Edward V and his brother were declared illegitimate by Parliament. Richard Duke of Gloucester, brother of Edward IV, asked to take the throne as Richard III .

- Summer of 1483

Edward V. and his brother have been murdered in the Tower of London.

- 7th of August 1485

Henry Tudor, last of the Lancastrians, landed at Milford Haven in Wales.

- 22nd of August 1485

Battle of Bosworth. King Richard III was killed and the Lancastrian Henry Tudor became King Henry VII.
